

The sunken rodeo arena continues to light up on the last weekend in October every year.



Harvey Dickson's Country Music Centre

Along a winding road with golden wattles and native trees, there is a farm 5kms from Boyup Brook.

Since the early signs of life in Boyup Brook, this farm has been in the Dickson family for three generations.

Around 1979 a change came over the Dickson farm when Country Music started to creep into the activities of farming life.

After a hard day's work a few farms would sit around the campfire and sing bush ballads. From these simple beginnings evolved the Harvey Dickson's Country Music Centre.


In 1985, a massive upgrading process was undertaken at the Harvey Dickson's Country Music Centre, the Chamberlain tractor and old Holden ute, along with all the other machinery were moved to other homes on the farm.

The machinery shed now named the "Bunyip Shed" was turned into a magnificent Country Music entertainment venue.

Over the next few years the shed was extended to build a bushman's bar, water fall and creek, stage, change rooms, shearing pens and a green room.

The entertainment shed was decorated wall to wall and rafter to rafter with banners, posters, original signs, old horse drawn wagons, memorabilia from 100 years ago to the present day, wooden sculptures which create a fantastic atmosphere.

The first show in the shed was the Dickson's 100 years celebration of the family being in Boyup Brook, 1885-1985. The first country music show was held in the old barn in 1969, the first Harvey Dickson's Country Music Show in the entertainment venue was in 1986.





The record room, some people like to call it the Elvis Room. Harvey started buying records when he was 14 then it turned into an obsession and is still buying records today. The room hasn't changed in the last 50 years, we are just running out of space. Folks look in wonder at the ambulance of records, posters, badges, books, spoons, can, t-shirts and Elvis Presley memorabilia on display.

All over the center you can see an assortment of animals sculptured out of wood. A 46ft guitar man stands tall and proud with his friend Banjo girl. The sculptures started out as a tree growing in the wild. Boots, hat, eyes and mouth have been added along with a 23ft metal guitar.
